Arizona Employment Increased by 63,900 Jobs since May 2023 Arizona Unemployment Decreased to 3.4%, a Record Low for Arizona*

The Arizona seasonally adjusted (SA) unemployment rate decreased to 3.4%, a record low for Arizona, in May 2024 from 3.6% in April 2024. The U.S. SA unemployment rate increased to 4.0% in May 2024 from 3.9% in April 2024.

Month over month, Arizona's SA labor force increased by 2,023 individuals, or 0.1%. Year over year, the SA labor force increased by 62,120 individuals, or 1.7%.

Month over month, Arizona not-seasonally adjusted (NSA) total nonfarm employment decreased by 10,300 jobs. Year over year, NSA total nonfarm employment increased by 63,900 jobs, or 2.0%. Arizona SA total nonfarm employment increased by 4,400 individuals, or 0.1%, month over month.

Month Over Month

Arizona NSA nonfarm employment decreased by 10,300 jobs in May. Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), NSA nonfarm employment lost 6,700 jobs on average in May. The private sector recorded a loss of 4,900 jobs in May, led by losses in Leisure & Hospitality (-4,600 jobs) and Professional & Business Services (-3,000 jobs). Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), private sector employment averaged a loss of 900 jobs in May. The government sector¹ recorded a loss of 5,400 jobs in May, less than the pre-pandemic (2010-2019) average loss of 5,700 jobs. Employment losses in the government sector occurred primarily within Local Government Education (-4,800 jobs).




Arizona NSA nonfarm employment increased by 63,900 jobs or 2.0% in May year over year. Private sector employment increased by 56,100 jobs year over year, while government employment increased by 7,800 jobs year over year.








Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate






Arizona & U.S. Construction Employment Year-to-Year Percent Change








Arizona & U.S. Employment Services Year-to-Year Percent Change

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
